<u>HB 2269</u> – **SUPPORT** - Regional transportation sector emissions programs; participation by Commonwealth. The bill provides that the Commonwealth shall be

allowed to participate in such a regional transportation sector emission program if the House of Delegates and the Senate of Virginia each adopt a resolution by two-thirds vote that specifically references and approves the regulatory text proposed for adoption by a state agency. [TCI - The 'Transportation and Climate Initiative' establishes a carbon fuel tax] The bill was vetoed, but language was inserted (and approved) in the budget.
